KySEA Policy Principles

Make **energy efficiency** Kentucky's top energy priority.

Promote the production of **clean, renewable energy** and increase the share of our energy that comes from it.

Create **new jobs and opportunities** in the clean energy sector, including a just transition for coal-affected communities and workers.

Enable **all residents and businesses to take advantage** of these energy solutions.

KySEA Policy Goals

Pass sound state energy policies in the 2012 state legislature. In 2012, Kentucky should pass legislation that establishes a renewable and efficiency portfolio standard and feed-in tariffs that boost in-state renewable energy production.

Energy Efficiency Offset 10.25% of statewide cumulative electricity use through new energy efficiency savings by 2022.

Renewable Energy Increase Kentucky's use of clean, renewable electricity sources to 12.5% in 2022.

Kentuckians are ready for clean and stable energy sources. KySEA is working to make these energy possibilities a reality.
